DID YOU KNOW?

... SAVIO STUDENTS HAVE CONSISTENTLY PERFORMED ABOVE NATIONAL AVERAGES IN BOTH PSAT AND AP TESTING?

PSAT TEST SCORES

The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) is offered in grades 9-11. The test not only prepares students to take the SAT but also helps to track test improvement and identifies potential AP course options and career interests. At Savio, students have consistently performed above national averages at all grade levels. As you can see from the attached graph, students are improving each year while tracking well above national averages. Students who meet entry requirements also compete in the National Merit Scholarship Program, an academic competition for recognition and scholarships.

AP TESTING SCORES

The Advanced Placement (AP) program enables students to pursue college-level studies while still in high school. At Savio, 77% of students take an AP level course during their high school years. Thirty-five percent of Savio graduates took 5 or more AP exams over the course of four years. Courses offered at the high school level prepare students to take exams that will allow them to earn college credit and/or skip introductory courses in college. The challenging course content also allows students to stand out on college applications. Since 2020, over 80% of Savio students have consistently received a score of 3 or higher on AP tests. Many U.S. colleges offer credit for AP Exam scores of 3 or higher.

Thirty Savio Latin students this year were honored for their outstanding performance on the National Latin Exam. Over 100,000 Latin students nationwide participate in the National Latin Exam each year. This year, 54 Savio Latin students took the exam, and more than half achieved recognition for their scores.

"The priests are usually on the aircraft carriers, so if we are out on a submarine, we have lay ministers who offer prayers for us.." Matthew Ryan French, Savio '14 In just 10 years, Savio alumnus Matthew Ryan French (2014) has become a Navy Lieutenant since leaving the Home of the Eagles.

Matthew was the first Savio student to accept (and complete) his undergraduate degree from Rice University, and he joined the Navy two years before graduating. He was admitted into the Navy's Nuclear Propulsion Officer Candidate program (NUPOC) and would eventually become the first commissioned officer from St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School.

Today, Matthew writes exercises and performs training instructions for submarines on the Pacific Coast. He says the Catholic Mass is not always available on submarines.

"The priests usually are on the aircraft carriers, so if we are out on a submarine, we have lay ministers who offer prayers for us," said Matthew, from his home in Washington State.

A man of strong faith today, he met his future wife, Kennedy, at a local parish where he lives. They married in 2022, and just welcomed a son, Frank, in 2024.

During his time at Savio, Matthew scored a field goal in the first varsity football game in September 2009, and he scored the first varsity points in any sport for Savio.

He set various records for Savio football as a kicker/punter and a forward for soccer. He was named all-district multiple years in soccer. He was extremely active in STEM, Music, and Academic competitions placing at state many times.

Currently working in Bangor, Washington, Matthew has been across the country while training for the Navy. He also has
