Principal's Address



Dear Savio Community,

The 2024-2025 academic year was one of excellence at St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School. While this annual report will showcase some of the highlights from this past year, excellence is something that happens every day at Savio: excellent teachers committed to the education and formation of our students, excellent students dedicated to learning, growing and serving others, and excellent staff who come to work every day ready to make Savio great.

The graduating class of 2025 performed over 19,000 hours of community service during their high school career with an economic value of over \$500,000. This year, Savio had four National Merit Finalists and four Commended Scholars. Ninety percent of the graduating class of 2025 took at least one AP (Advanced Placement) Exam, and they completed a total of 469 AP Exams.

Thirty-five of our student-athletes received TAPPS 6A All-District recognitions, nine received All-State recognition, and 12 received Academic All-State recognition.

Seventeen students competed in Austin Regional Science Fair, four placed in Top five and one advanced to State Science Fair.

Savio began a DECA Club, a student organization that prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs for careers in marketing, finance, hospitality, and management, and one student advanced to the state DECA Competition.

Two members of the band received All-State recognition, three received All-Region, and 28 received Superior Ratings at the Solo and Ensemble competition. One member of the orchestra received All-State recognition, five received All-Region, and 18 received Superior Ratings at the Solo and Ensemble competition.

Nineteen students were awarded the Regional Scholastic Art Awards, and our Robotics team finished as the Runner Up at the TAPPS State Competition.

Thank you to the whole Savio community: faculty, staff, students, and parents who continue to foster a faith-filled, academically rigorous community of faith dedicated to forming servant leaders in the image of Christ.

SERVANT LEADERSHIP

"My decision to become a Catholic high school student in Texas has changed my life." - Xiaobao Feng (Max)



A year and a half ago, as a foreign student who had just arrived in the United States. I faced a huge cultural change. The unfamiliar environment, new culture, and different concepts and social norms posed a huge challenge to me and made me constantly lose myself. However, in this strangeness, the Savio football coach's enthusiasm helped me find an unexpected way to belong on the football field. Although I was inexperienced and had never even touched a football. I was invited by the coach to join the school team. This was not just a sport - it was the real starting point for my entry into American high school life. It slowly helped me integrate into the surrounding environment and made me truly feel that I was a part of this community rather than an outsider. Football not only taught me the skills of the game but also taught me resilience, teamwork, and the joy of collective efforts. In the end, I really integrated into this vibrant school - I deeply felt the power of sports.

This profound experience also made me feel the huge contrast between the sports education I received in my hometown and what I am experiencing in the United States today and also exposed some problems. Many of the sports programs in China have lost the support of the people because of poor performance, and many sports cannot be promoted in society because of people's distrust. But witnessing the Savio passion for sports and the community spirit surrounding it, a desire was ignited deep in my heart: I wanted to bring this transformative power back to my home country.

Although I am unable to continue playing for the school team due to my busy academic schedule in my senior year of high school, the lessons and personal growth I gained from football were deeply imprinted in the depths of my life - unforgettable and precious. With this belief, I returned to a small city in southern China in the summer. My goal was clear: to embody the principles of servant leadership by contributing to the foundation of sports development. I became an assistant football coach, guiding students of different ages - from kindergarteners taking their first meaningful steps on the field to elementary, middle and high school students honing their skills. It's not just about teaching the rules of the game, but also about cultivating a love for sports activities, cultivating a spirit of teamwork, and instilling discipline.

I know that I am not an excellent football player who had only played one season, but I am willing to watch teaching videos in my spare time and watch videos with them. I know I will not teach them the skills perfectly, but I want to spread a persistent belief and attitude of loving sports. I believe that real change starts with small actions, and we must understand that the younger generation has huge, untapped potential, enough to reshape the entire landscape. My wish is to be a small "fertilizer" to nourish these nascent sprouts and help them grow strong.

For others, such as Vy Williams, who will be a senior in the 2025-26 academic year at St. Dominic Savio Catholic High School, her decision to join the Catholic faith at the 2025 Easter Vigil at St. Vincent de Paul with Celebrant Father Tom Reitmeyer, JCL, was made with a full-hearted, open-minded, and independent YES!

Vy credits Sister Mary Esther of the Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist, and the class Sister offered her junior year, Catholicism 101, for opening her mind and

heart to what she calls "the truth".







"I was never raised in a religion, so coming into Savio my freshman year, I started to learn more about the faith," said Williams, during this past summer from her home. "I learned from the Dominican Sisters that it was more than just a faith; it was a teaching of what was really happening, and it was easy for me to believe and understand."

Admittedly, Vy's mother is not Catholic, but her father is, so when she decided to accept the fact that Jesus was tugging on her heart to do more, she says it was easy for her to walk through the steps to becoming a member of the Catholic faith. After Vy's older sister ran away, her father felt it would be good for Vy to have God by her side as well.

"Over time, I wanted to be a part of the faith to receive the Eucharist, to be Baptized and Confirmed, and Sister's class, Catholicism 101, made the process more possible for me, she said. "Mr. G from Robotics was my sponsor, and I chose the Kloke family as my Godparents."

The joy in Vy's voice is palpable when she talks about the Savio students supporting her at the Easter vigil, and seeing them while she walked through each of the Sacraments.

"What this journey gave me is community, honestly," said Williams. "I am kind of an only child because of my sister's leaving. Sometimes it's really lonely, so God helps me, and knowing he's right there, teaching me lessons. For example, my favorite Bible story is the Prodigal Son. That hit me hard because it teaches us about forgiveness for one who has left. It made me realize that if she were to return, her vision would be cleared, and I would forgive her."

Vy is now helping with the new class of RCIA students. Welcome home, Vy!








TUITION ASSISTANCE



One of the defining characteristics of Catholic Schools is making a Catholic education accessible to all families and students who desire to attend. Many of the first Catholic Schools in the United States were run by religious communities and were actually tuition free, as an extension of their mission of evangelization. Obviously Catholic schools have changed a lot over the years and are not run or staffed by religious communities, but we carry on this mission of Catholic schools and of evangelization by offering tuition assistance to families who would otherwise not be able to afford a Catholic education. Families' socioeconomic status should never be a deterrent to a child receiving a quality Catholic education.

Tuition assistance is also a very personal issue for me. Growing up I was able to attend a Catholic elementary school because my mother worked at the school. When I was getting ready to attend a Catholic High School in Houston, my father lost his job. Without the tuition assistance my family received, I would not have been able to attend a Catholic High School, and I am pretty sure I wouldn't be the person I am today without the Catholic formation and education I received. Tuition assistance is a core part of who we are here at Savio and how we live out our mission of forming servant leaders in the image of Christ.

Thanks in part to your generous support of the Eagle Fund appeal in 2024, St. Dominic Savio was able to purchase a new full-size school bus for transportation to and from school and other events, such as Imago Christi's day of service.
